The SPIC aims to become a platform to lead the implementation of the peace and security agenda and seek joint response by bringing together experts from academia and state-funded research organizations to carry out joint research and to hold the Seoul Peace Initiative Conference on annual basis.

The first Seoul Peace Initiative Conference will be held for two days on November 8-9, 2021 under the theme of "Road to Peace and Coexistence in Cities and the World". The conference will provide a place for the international peace and security experts participating in the SPIC to discuss the issues of discrimination and conflicts occurring in Seoul and around the world. The conference will also serve as a forum for public discussion on the promotion of coexistence and peace on the Korean Peninsula, in Northeast Asia, and throughout the world.

Amid the prolonged COVID-19 pandemic, complex crises emerged from a range of issues, spanning a global recession, a growing nationalism, the global vaccine divide, and discrimination against ethnic minorities. These crises are not only jeopardizing national security, but also threatening safe and peaceful lives of citizens in cities.

Against this backdrop, we intend to diagnose the peace and security issues facing the world and discuss ways to ensure people lead safe and peaceful lives. To this end, The Seoul Institute formed a partnership with international research institutes dedicated to research into peace and security and created the Seoul
